The Path We've Jaken: Bur History



Our Little Haven began as a dream of Scott and Kathleen Hummel at the beginning of 1989. Our Little Haven was born with a specific vision: to create a community where children are cherished. That vision is the enduring promise we continue to work towards today. Since our inception, we sought to do things differently. We were provoked by what we saw to be missing in the social services sector: early intervention for children during their formative years, designed to make a lasting impact. We desired to create a community-based model in response to the needs of the young and vulnerable population in the St. Louis community.

Connecting with hundreds of social service and medical providers, it was clear that the need was great and Our Little Haven began to take shape. After turning to family and friends, a Board of Directors was formed using the extraordinary talents of close friends. Shortly after in 1993, we opened our doors with a capacity of 24 children, and Our Little Haven expanded quickly to support 40 children. As our organization grew in learning how best to serve children and families, proven community-based programs and facilities were added to increase impact and growth.

What began as a residential program for children – has evolved and is now a full scale, premier early intervention children and family services agency. Over time we have expanded our services to create a comprehensive model, providing three unique yet complimentary programs: Keystone Mental Health Services, Our Little Academy Day Treatment, and Community Family Services at the Taylor Family Care Center.

The Problem: What Our Families Face

Too many children in our community face trauma, abuse, neglect, or serious mental health challenges without the resources or support to heal. Nearly 1 in 5 children experience mental health disorders. Thousands face placement instability, developmental delays, or behavioral disruptions that prevent them from thriving.

These children are often:

- Expelled from multiple preschools
- Shuffled between foster homes
- Waiting months for mental health care
- Overlooked in systems with critical gaps

Families navigating these crises face isolation, stigma, and financial hardship. They need coordinated, compassionate, and accessible support.

Bur Solution: Farly Intervention

At Our Little Haven, we believe that early intervention is the most effective and compassionate way to support long-term healing and stability. Our mission is rooted in catching children early - in the formative years when their emotional, mental, and behavioral health is still developing and most receptive to care.

a Metaphor: The Cookie Jar



At Our Little Haven, we use a metaphor to describe our work:

We believe that when we're born, God gives each of us an empty Cookie Jar. With every nurturing moment - a hug, a kind word, a sense of safety, a lesson learned - we get a cookie added to our jar.

During the earliest years of life, what we call the formative years, the Cookie Jar is wide open. These are the years when it's easiest to fill the jar - when children are naturally absorbing the emotional "ingredients" they need to grow strong: trust, connection, confidence, and joy.

But for many of the children and families we serve, that process has been disrupted. Trauma, instability, or adversity may have left their Cookie Jars emptier than they should be.

That's why early intervention matters. As children grow, their Cookie Jars don't disappear - but the lid begins to tighten. Life gets more complex, and it becomes harder (though never impossible) to add the same kinds of cookies. That's why the early years are such a powerful time to build a foundation of resilience, well-being, and hope.

At Our Little Haven, we help fill those Cookie Jars - and just as importantly, we help children and families learn how to bake their own cookies, so they can keep filling their jars for years to come.

Help us fill Cookie Jars with safety, support, and love - one child, one family, one cookie at a time.

Three Programs of Impact



Keystone Mental Health Services

An outpatient mental health practice serving over 150 children and families annually. Keystone specializes in early intervention for the very young child, comprehensive psychological evaluations, play therapy, family therapy, psychiatry, complex conditions, and cultural responsiveness.



Our Little Academy Day Treatment (OLA)

A full-day, year-round day treatment program for preschool age children who cannot attend traditional programs due to behavioral or mental health challenges. OLA provides intensive therapy, family support, and prepares children for a successful transition to kindergarten.



Community Family Services

Launched in 2024, CFS provides targeted supports for children and families in foster care:

- Coordination of Medical Services (COMS):
 Registered nurse-led navigation of medical needs
- Diligent Ongoing Relative Search (DORS): Identifying and connecting children to family members
- Accelerated Permanency Support (APS): Legal and casework assistance to speed up permanency

What Makes Us Different

- A 32-year legacy of innovation and compassion
- Clinicians specialized in the very young child
- High therapist-to-child ratios (1:2 at Our Little Academy)
- Continuum of care across programs
- Access regardless of ability to pay
- Family-centered approach
- Consistent evaluation and accountability

How We Evaluate Success

Each of Our Little Haven's core programs includes built-in outcome tracking and performance evaluation. We use evidence-based tools, client feedback, and real-time data to measure effectiveness and guide continuous improvement through our Performance & Quality Improvement (PQI) process. These evaluation tools keep us accountable to our mission, and to every child and family we serve.

Keystone Mental Health Services

Success is measured by a decrease in symptoms and an increase in functioning. Treatment outcomes are tracked using standardized assessments such as BASC-3, Conners-4, and the Trauma Symptom Checklist, aligned with individualized treatment goals. Psychological evaluations include structured follow-up interviews to assess understanding of results and barriers to care. For psychiatry clients, the Children's Global Assessment Scale (CGAS) tracks functioning over time, with a 5-point improvement considered successful.

Our Little Academy Day Treatment

Success is measured by a decrease in symptoms and an increase in functioning, leading to a successful transition to kindergarten. Each child's treatment plan is reviewed every 90 days, with specific, measurable goals tracked weekly. A goal, such as reduced outbursts or use of coping skills, is considered achieved when maintained for four consecutive weeks.

Community Family Services

Progress is tracked using real-time dashboards and outcome-specific spreadsheets.

- Coordination of Medical Services: Reduced ER visits, established medical/dental homes, improved rates of exams and specialist care.
- Diligent Ongoing Relative Search: At least 25 relatives identified per child; placements tracked.
- Accelerated Permanency Support: Guardianships and adoptions completed, time from referral to permanency, and TPR (termination of parental rights) progress are measured.

Giving Opportunties

Every gift to Our Little Haven is an investment in a child's healing journey.



Keystone Mental Health Services

- \$165 provides 1 hour of therapy at Keystone for one child
- \$3,000 supports a psychological evaluation at Keystone
- <u>\$5,520</u> sponsors a full year of therapy for a child at Keystone



Our Little Academy
Day Treatment

- \$158 supports one child at Our Little Academy for a day
- \$3,475 funds one child at Our Little Academy for one month
- \$400 funds one Accelerated Permanency Support case





 \$2,600 supports one child for a year of Coordination of Medical Services

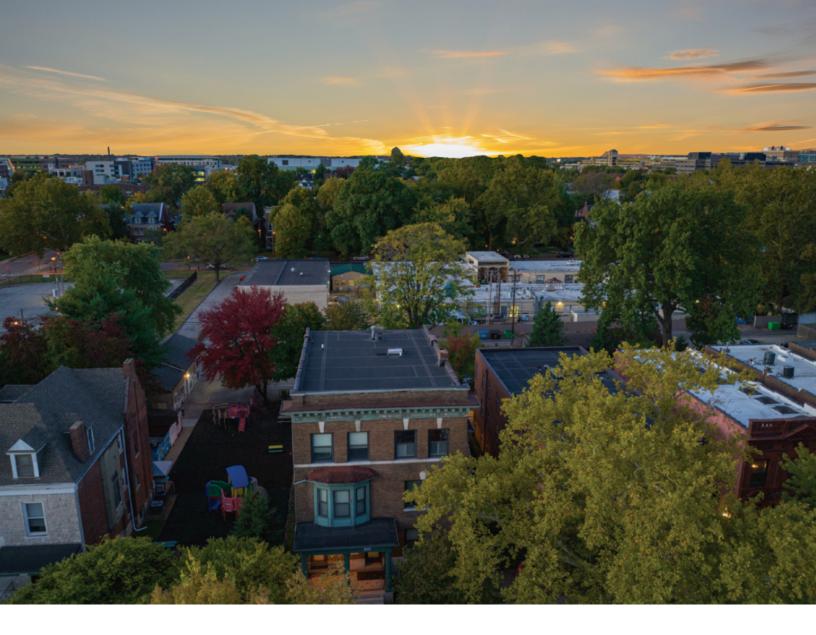
